
Beach Volleyball

The origin of beach volleyball:
People in Hawaii and in Santa Monica, in southern California, began playing volleyball on the beach in the early 1900s. These games had six people in each team, as in ordinary indoor volleyball. Today's form of beach volleyball began one day in 1930 in Santa Monica. When only four players arrived for a volleyball game on the beach, they decided to play with only two people in each team. Beach volleyball became an Olympic sport in 1996.

Equipment:
net, beach volleyball

How to play:

- There are two teams of two players.
- The game begins with a "serve" to get the ball over the net to the other team's side.
- Players hit the ball from one side of the net to the other, between the teams.
- A team gets a point when the other team cannot return the ball or when the ball hits the ground on the other side of the net.
- The first team to score 21 points wins the game, unless the other team has got 20 points. When the score is 21-20, the game continues until one team has got two more points than the other team.
